


Fig. 76. Trådtelefon.

Course Overview

Most things in the world are *meaningless*. That is, they do not portray the world as being a certain way. Language is one of the very few exceptions to this: words and sentences *mean* things. That is, they are *about* things: the word 'dog' is about/means/refers to dogs. The sentence "dogs bark" says that dogs bark. These word-world connections are unrestricted by spatial and temporal constraints: while I can't see or touch Confucius, I can talk about him. How is this possible?

This course will provide an overview of philosophical theories of linguistic meaning. We will center our course around two questions. The *semantic* question: What do words mean? And the *meta-semantic* question: What makes words mean what they do? We will look at a variety of classical and contemporary answers to these questions. Along the way, we will consider some of the deepest topics in philosophy: the relations between language, mind, and the world.
